Envision Schools is seeking a smart, experienced and passionate college advisor who wants to work in a student-centered environment of respect and trust with high expectations for all members of the community. The college advisor's main role is to foster a college-bound environment, support students' successful transition to college, and ensure that all students are 4-year college eligible.

College Advising Responsibilities:

- Build and sustain a school-wide culture of attending college (9-12 grade enrollment <475 students)
- Support Envision Schools graduates in college with periodic personal check-ins, mentoring, and social networking (e.g. Facebook virtual community)
- As an active member of key faculty teams, teach, and support critical college preparation curriculum/experiences through Academic Seminar/Advisory classes and special events (e.g. quest speakers, college fairs, college trips)
- Assist students in navigating the college search and application process
- Facilitate college admission and financial aid workshops for students and parents
- Track and report key student performance indicators to school leadership on a monthly basis (e.g. student credits, progress toward graduation, college eligibility, college/program applications, college/program acceptances, scholarships)
- Ensure all eligible students apply to a 4-year college program, including a required application to the local California State University
- Support scholarship search, application, and award processes for students
- Maintain external relationships to bring services or opportunities to the school (e.g. SAT test preparation courses, quest speakers)
- Support and facilitate concurrent enrollment with local colleges, as appropriate
- Follow up with students after graduation (e.g. calls, e-mails, coordinated Advisor outreach) to identify and problem-solve barriers to college matriculation
- Other duties as assigned

Systems Responsibilities:

- Promote the use of students' graduation portfolios for college admission
- Administer, with others, the Workplace Learning Experience program for juniors and seniors
- Coordinate school site testing processes pertinent to college (e.g. PSAT, SAT, ACT, etc.)
- Ensure school courses are submitted to UC and other agencies for course approval (e.g. NCAA)
- Other duties as assigned

Collaboration and Networking Responsibilities:

- Collaborate with other Envision School college advisors and staff to achieve our mission
- Develop and maintain relationships with colleges
- Cultivate relationships with community organizations
- Develop a student alumni network that will provide support to current high school students (e.g. guest speakers, hosts for college visits) and prospective/incoming college students (e.g. a college ambassador role to support younger students)
- Support the post-graduate tracking study
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications:

- B.A. or B.S. required, M.A. preferred
- Certificate in College Counseling, PPS Credential, or equivalent experience
- Experience working with parents and families, especially those from less-advantaged backgrounds
- Successful work experience with youth
- Strong professional collaborative skills
- Excellent communication skills
- Commitment to the mission of Envision Schools
- Ability to work well under pressure and adapt easily
- Comfortable with a dynamic environment
